Dear Mr. Sanikidze:

We are intellectual property counsel to SCI Services, Inc. ("SCI"). As you are no doubt aware, SCI is a residential mortgage servicer, which, itself and through its subsidiaries and affiliated companies such as Saxon Mortgage Services, Inc., services nearly 300,000 residential mortgages in 50 states and the District of Columbia.

SCI is the owner of the SAXON family of marks, including SAXON, SAXON MORTGAGE, INC. and SAXON HOME MORTGAGE, which have been developed and used by SCI and its predecessors-in-interest since 1992. As a result of extensive use and significant investment, the SAXON family of marks has become a well-known and an extremely important asset with enormous good will.

SCI is also the owner of the top level domain names SAXONONLINE.COM and SAXONMORTGAGE.COM, and operates websites under these domain names that provide information about and access to SCI's mortgage services.

It has come to our attention that you have registered, without our client's authorization, the domain name SAXONMORTGAGE.ORG (the "Domain Name"), which is confusingly similar to our client's SAXON family of marks. It appears from our initial investigation that you have no legitimate interest in the Domain Name or use of the SAXON family of marks. Based on the foregoing, your registration and use of the Domain Name violates our client's rights in the SAXON family of marks.

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We demand prompt transfer of the Domain Name and any other domain name(s) that incorporate our client's SAXON family of marks owned by you or any person or entity affiliated with you. We regard this matter with the utmost seriousness, and request that you confirm to the undersigned, in writing, no later than the close of business on **Monday, March 7, 2011**, that you agree to the above demand.

While we wish to reach an amicable, non-adversarial resolution of this matter, please be assured that SCI vigorously protects its intellectual property rights as necessary. If we do not receive confirmation from you that you will comply with our request, we will have no choice but to advise our client to pursue any and all available rights and remedies.

The foregoing is without prejudice to any of our client's rights and remedies, all of which are expressly reserved.
